



MHFS ATHLETE'S CODE OF CONDUCT

The club's code of conduct outlines and supports our goals in developing good sportsmanship, care and respectfulness of others and their equipment, in striving to be the best you can be and in turn be respected.

Training and competing in an Alpine resort is a privilege and all athletes need to abide by the Alpine Responsibility Code (ARC) and treat all mountain operation staff, ski patrollers and resort guests with respect.

It is the participant's responsibility for their own conduct during all MHFS related activities:

- Our expectation of this conduct is to be of the highest level at all times in representation of the club
- Be fair and honest, and display good sportsmanship at all times
- Display gentility, integrity and respect for all others
- Demonstrate general courtesy and dignity to other members and the public
- Display good manners at all times
- Support other club members
- Show good decision making
- The club implements a 'No Bullying Policy' or disciplinary action will occur
- Look after other people's equipment as if it was your own
- Represent MHFS with pride and consider your actions when wearing your uniform or do not wear MHFS jacket outside of training time
- Athletes are to refrain from the use of alcohol, tobacco, e-cigarettes (vapes), drugs and abusive or foul language at all times
- Understand your responsibility and do not bring the MHFS club into disrepute from actions outside of training times
- Athletes will maintain a clean and tidy appearance during travel and competition
- Athletes will adhere to all other travel, school and training policies as outlined from other resorts
- Remember your actions will reflect the club and we take pride in providing you with the best coaches, training, facilities and endorse you as a positive role model for the club and others
- Athletes must wear a helmet and back brace whilst participating in MHFS programs and whilst being coached and competing in competitions
- Athletes are expected to strive to develop as individuals by being coachable and respectful of others
- Athletes or Family are expected to directly seek understanding and resolution when questions or problems arise with coaches and teammates within a timely manner

Any breaches of these codes will result in disciplinary action.

Serious breaches will result in suspension or expulsion from Mount Hotham Free Ski.
